New Roof On Building 2

Monday, August 15. That was the day the large crane arrived at our front entrance and a crew from Saco Roofing started removing rocks, pavers, the old roofing and insulation from the Building 2 roof as seen in the photos below.





Leaks on Building 2 started in 2014 when Sprint installed a new antenna on the lower section of that roof and the sharp rocks penetrated the rubber membrane when workers walked on it. The new insulation and roofing material is attached to the concrete using screws and anchors and needs no ballast. Here's a view of the old roof with rocks and pavers needed to hold the roofing down in winds:

On the lower roof (on the right side in the above photo), you can see a walkway path that gives a visible and extra strong layer to prevent damage. The left side of the photo shows the upper roof. All the raised curbs where fans, ducts and vent pipes exit the roof were redone and all new aluminum flashing was installed around the outside perimeter. The project went smoothly thanks to outstanding work by Saco Roofing and research and planning by our Board of Directors.

Help Wanted

Congratulations to residents who are helping the environment by participating in our successful recycle program. The program which began two years ago keeps getting better. We started with one pickup a week, then quickly went to twice weekly pickups. In response to recent requests from residents, we now have three pickups a week.
