Ron and Carolyn Cilley - #141

When Carolyn Cilley first saw our building, she said, "That's the building I want to live in." She and her husband, Ron, own a home with panoramic lake views in Harrison, Maine near Bridgton Hospital where Ron works. While she's happy with the large rural house they built in Harrison, Carolyn started dreaming about a second home—a condo in Portland. She said, "I think Portland is the perfect size. I love the ocean, and this is a beautiful location on the Eastern Promenade."

Ron and Carolyn met in Phoenix where she grew up and where he, an obstetrician/gynecologist, did his residency. He practiced in Phoenix for 25 years before returning to his home state of Maine in 1994. Over the years Ron has delivered 6,000 babies. That's not a typo; yes, that's 6,000 babies.

Carolyn was a "stay-at-home mom" until their children were grown and then worked as director of a women's fitness program. She also traveled as a speaker on women's health and fitness. She works out four or five days a week, and says, "I'm a 20-year breast cancer survivor."

Ron likes the convenience of Portland and being near the airport. In March they're flying to Miami where they'll begin a 10-day cruise to Madeira and then visit Casablanca and Barcelona. Past travels include the Mediterranean, the Caribbean, Europe and Russia. Their favorite destinations, though, are Wilton, Connecticut (a 4-hour drive from

Portland) and Chicago (a 2-hour plane ride). You may wonder what the attraction is in these locations. The answer is their grandsons—5-year old Ryan in Connecticut and 6-year old Mason in Chicago. "They are the lights of my life," said Carolyn.

In the eight years since they bought their condo, Ron and Carolyn have seen many changes at Promenade Towers. Ron says, "I'm impressed with how the building has turned around since the construction project." He and Carolyn are currently renovating their unit, starting with new kitchen cabinets and granite countertops. They've also opened up the space between the kitchen and the dining room. Except for the countertops, Ron is doing all the work himself. He said, "My dad was a handyman, and I worked for him when I was going to college." Besides delivering babies, some of Ron's skills include carpentry, plumbing, painting and electrical work. As their renovation project continues, installing hardwood floors is on his "to-do" list.
